Wellness program (April 19 – May 17, 2017) We are participating is DietBet – This program is run by an on-line company that acts as referee. Each participant makes a commitment to losing 4% of body weight in a one month time period. The commitment is fortified by each individual making a bet that the weight loss will occur, and is based on scientific principles of behavioral change.

An initial weigh in involves a full length photograph in shirt and shorts while on a scale, and a photograph of the scale weight reading which includes a written password given to each participant. At the end of the month a weigh-out is held. The on-line referee accepts the initial and final weights.

Each individual that loses 4% of weight then receives a payout of the pot (less administrative fees).

We held an evening program on February 16, 2017 which was sponsored with Sisterhood – Artists and Artisans – featuring synagogue and community artists who brought in their artwork
